The Commission requested, with the abutting Gillette land being the jewel of the open space in that area of town, that they be included when events are conducted that highlight the Horse Meadow Knoll land. Peter Dorward suggested reaching out to Sudbury Valley Trustees as they typically conduct the public events for the property.

Wendy Sisson made a motion to endorse the municipal certification as part of the conservation restriction for Horse Meadow Knoll, along Sherry Road. Jim Burns seconded the motion. The vote was unanimously in favor of the motion.

#### Yohhan Kumarasinghe Eagle Scout Project - Plant Identification Signs on the Small Land

Yohhan Kumarasinghe, a local Eagle Scout, was present to discuss his proposal to make improvements to the Small Nature Trail behind Harvard Elementary School (HES). Mr. Kumarasinghe has designed a new sign to replace the existing sign, which will include a trail map. He plans to install plant identification signs to assist students at HES. Jim Burns asked about an ongoing maintenance plan and suggested having some of the Boy Scouts take it on. It was recommended that the new sign include "managed by the Harvard School Committee".

Carl Sciple made a motion to endorse the project as discussed this evening and not require a filing with the Commission for the activity. Jim Burns seconded the motion. The vote was unanimously in favor of the motion.

Steve Sears, of Ross Associates, explained the existing system is in failure and needs to be replaced. The current system is within 35' of the wetland area, the proposed system will be at 75' with grading. Members of the Commission conducted a site walk earlier this week and found there to be no issues with the design as proposed.

During the site walk this week, trees to be removed were discussed. The plan has been revised to properly indentify the trees to be removed and those that are to remain.
