- What is possible within the latitude of the Municipal Light Plant entity?

Vendor / Partner Updates:

- Lightower Fiber wants a follow up meeting
- Neighborly wants a follow up meeting

Financing Options:

- Could we create a nonprofit / private business that is tied to the MLP?
- Possible to form a "cooperative"
- Energy New England operates as a cooperative essentially a private enterprise

Governance Model for MLP:

- Separate group of experts should be elected/appointed to govern the MLP
- Light Board (elected) vs Light Commission (appointed)
