## Agenda:

1 – Approval of meeting minutes of 6-8-23: approved unanimously.

- 2 Events/Outreach Update
  - ➤ Coaching session: 30 people came, 7 coaches at different tables, presentation by HeatSmart Alliance. 9 people signed up for coaches, many wanted ground source heat pumps. Plan to conduct such events a couple of times/year.
  - Forest Management: In collaboration with HCT, 2 events planned: Late October -Tour of 2 different trails Sherry Rd which is well tended forest and Muller land which is not well managed. Want to start forest management coaches to teach/coach about land management & invasives in resident's property.
  - ➤ Panel discussion on land management still in the planning stage. Topic could be Chapter 61 forest land and conservation restrictions
  - Flags: New statement: "We are Going Green" accepted. Members need to do testimonial on Harvard Energize & will be given flags. Starting with HCIC members, then Earth Day home owner participants and Green Team. Then will begin advertising to Sendpulse list and the public.

## 4 – CAP Implementation Update

- Transportation: Reviewed to see if changes were needed.
  - HEAC to work on charging stations on municipal property as private properties are difficult to access.
  - PB could investigate adding charging stations to by-laws if a developer wants parking areas.
  - Residents: encourage transition to electric vehicles. (12 EVs purchased in Harvard between February and May.)
  - Park & Ride locations request made to MART to get service to morning & evening trains at Littleton Station.
  - Revision getting student drivers aware of consequences of car emissions and providing for community service approach re. climate to offset emissions rather than approaching payment for parking.
- Preparedness: goals are as stated. No changes to action items but keep abreast of whether COA might become a cooling & warming center.
- 5 OSC-PRD Bylaw Update: Planning Board opening hearing on July 17 on by-law that will go to town meeting in October. Looking for HCIC support. HCIC commented earlier and they have been incorporated.
- 6 Advocacy Ellen will send out website which lists bills which Jamie or Dan are supporting.
