Paddle board rack build – PVC pipe rack 8 feet long, 6 wide, will hold 10 paddleboards

PVC will last longer than pressure treated wood near water, price is comparable and it has less of an environmental impact; Design – ladder design, boards resting on three rungs, could be modular to allow for expansion, 2 Azek boards; Schedule – ideally done by mid-July, possibly June
