

WARRANT FOR THE SPECIAL TOWN MEETING THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS

To the Constable of the Town of Harvard:

GREETINGS:

In the name of the Commonwealth, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the said Town, who are qualified to vote in Town affairs, to meet in the Cronin Auditorium at The Bromfield School on Tuesday, the 9th day of November, 2004 at 7:30 P.M. by the clock to act on the following articles:

ARTICLE 1: FISCAL YEAR 2005 BUDGET ADJUSTMENTS

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds, a sum of money to be added to or to make adjustments to certain line items of Article 6 of the Warrant for the Annual Town Meeting of March 27, 2004, or pass any vote or votes in relation thereto.

ARTICLE 2: SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT RECRUITMENT & NON-RECURRING SCHOOL EXPENDITURES

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds, a sum of money, to be expended by the School Committee, for expenses related to the recruitment of a superintendent of schools and for other non-recurring school expenditures, with unexpended funds as of June 30, 2005, being returned to their funding source, or pass any vote or votes in relation thereto.

ARTICLE 3: BEEDE WASTE OIL SUPERFUND SITE

To see if the Town will vote to amend its vote taken under Article 14 of the Warrant for the April 6, 2002 Annual Town Meeting by raising and appropriating or transferring from available funds, the additional sum of \$8,339 to be expended by the Board of Selectmen to fund the Town's share of the costs of cleaning up the Beede Waste Oil Superfund Site in Plaistow, New Hampshire, or pass any vote or votes in relation thereto.

ARTICLE 4: ASSISTANCE TO FIREFIGHTERS GRANT

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or transfer from available funds, a sum of money, to be expended by the Fire Chief, with the approval of the Board of Selectmen, for the Town's contribution towards a Federal Emergency Management Agency's Assistance to Firefighters Grant for the purchase of self-contained breathing apparatus and protective clothing, with unexpended funds as of June 30, 2005, being returned to their funding source, or pass any

vote or votes in relation thereto.

ARTICLE 5: GENERAL STABILIZATION FUND

To see if the Town will vote to transfer from Free Cash, a sum of money to be placed in the General Stabilization Fund, or pass any vote or votes in relation thereto.

ARTICLE 6: PROPERTY TAX ABATEMENT FOR A BLIND PERSON


To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 59, Section 5, Clause Thirty-seventh A to provide an abatement in the amount of \$500 of the actual taxes due of a blind person, or pass any vote or votes in relation thereto.

ARTICLE 7: ACCEPT MGL CHAPTER 138, SECTION 12B

To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 138, Section 12B to prohibit live nudity at a premises licensed to sell alcoholic beverages, or pass any vote or votes in relation thereto.




